READING THE SKY LIKE A PRO: WEATHER TOOLS THAT BUILD BETTER PILOTS

June marks the true start of South Florida's convective season, and with it comes one of the most valuable skill sets a pilot can develop: knowing how to use the tools at your fingertips to make smart, confident decisions in the air.

DATALINK WEATHER, DECODED

ADS_IN weather gives you a real time picture of what's happening around you, from NEXRAD radar returns to METARs and TAFs along your route. It's a powerful planning tool, but the best pilots treat it as one input among several, not the whole story. Knowing its limitations is just as important as knowing how to read it.

THE VALUE OF A GOOD PIREP

Pilot reports are one of the most underused tools in general aviation, and they're also one of the most trusted. A PIREP from another aircraft flying the same route minutes ago tells you something no forecast can: what conditions actually look like right now. Filing one yourself adds to that picture for the next pilot behind you.

MAKING THE CALL

Every solid go no go decision blends several sources: the official briefing, current radar, pilot reports, and your own judgment about personal minimums. June teaches that discipline quickly. The pilots who build strong habits this season carry them for the rest of their flying careers.
